B. Graduate Student Mentoring:

In the fifteen years I have been at the USD, I have mentored 44 students for their Master's Projects in Health Sciences, and 21 students for their Doctoral Projects in Health Sciences. All the 65 students (44 master's degree students and 21 doctoral students) successfully completed their research projects and graduated. I am also the faculty advisor and dissertation committee Chair for two PhD in Health Science students. I am in the dissertation committees of three other students. One of my PhD students graduated in 2020 and I served in the dissertation committees of two other students who also graduated in spring 2020. Internationally, I am a co-supervisor for a PhD student at the University of Cape Town in South Africa. I was also a co-supervisor for another PhD student at Stellenbosch University in Cape town, South Africa, who graduated in 2019.

C. Advising:

Currently I have 11 student advisees in the Occupational Therapy Program. Over my employment at the USD, including the current 11 students, I have advised over 190 students. The advising process involves at least one mandatory 15 to 30 minute meeting every semester in which each of the student-advisee's progress in the development of professional behaviors is assessed and strategies are developed to facilitate further professional development. Extra meetings are arranged as needed, and student-advisees are encouraged to meet with advisors any time they need to talk about anything, or even just to keep the advisors posted regarding what is happening in their lives.

D. Development of Teaching Strategies, Assessments, Methods:

While at The USD, I published an instructor's resource manual (Ikiugu, 2007b) which includes sample test questions that instructors using my book (Ikiugu, 2007a) as a textbook in their psychosocial rehabilitation courses can use to assess their students' mastery of psychosocial rehabilitation principles. The resource manual is based on strategies derived from Bloom's

taxonomy. I use these strategies in all my classes. I have also contributed significantly to the development of the psychosocial and research content in the Occupational Therapy curriculum. The content includes instructional and assessment methods. I also developed a method of assessing teaching effectiveness by using course goals to develop pretest/posttest surveys as a way of gauging how students perceive their progress towards course objectives. This method of assessing teaching effectiveness is meant to be used in conjunction with other formal methods used at the USD and peer evaluations. The effectiveness of these teaching assessment methods in teaching methods in not only mastering content but also applying it to clinical situations was reported in a paper that was published back in 2015 (Ikiugu & Smallfield, 2015). As more data accumulates, eventually I will conduct a meta-analysis to determine the overall teaching effectiveness of these strategies. Such analysis will be very informative about the modifications that may need to be made to teaching and outcome assessment strategies in the occupational therapy department. In addition, recently, I have been involved in a project to incorporate Diversity, Inclusivity, and Cultural Awareness in academic programming. The project is interdisciplinary involving occupational therapy and physical therapy students.
